20/20 EVANGELISM

[**Editor's Note:** The following article was printed in *Words of Truth* (April 9, 1992). I remembered the article and was able to find it. I have included it since it goes so well with the theme that brother Clarke sets forth on page 3 of this issue.]

In Acts 20:20, Paul gives a recipe for 20/20 evangelism. 20/20 vision is the best kind of vision one can have. Likewise, 20/20 evangelism is the best kind of evangelism for the Lord's church to practice. Hear the words of the apostle as they are recorded by Luke: "And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have showed you, and have taught you publicly, and from house to house." Let us briefly analyze this passage.

"And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you ..." Paul

preached everything that pertained to life and godliness unto them. He wasn't afraid to teach them the truth, even if it might hurt their feelings. Paul kept nothing back that was profitable for them to hear. Evangelism in the 20th century must follow this same pattern. Remember the words that Paul wrote to Timothy: "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is PROFITABLE for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness: that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works" (2 Timothy 3:16, 17). If we are to follow the pattern set forth by Paul, we must preach all Scripture to all people, because all Scripture is profitable for the things that are listed in 2 Timothy 3:16, 17. If we preach just doctrine and no reproof or correction, we are holding back things

that are profitable, and we are failing to declare the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:27). This is sin, and it is not 20/20 evangelism. We must preach the Word in season, out of season; when they like it and when they don't. This involves reproof and exhortation with all longsuffering and doctrine (2 Timothy 4:2). It is easy to contrast Paul with many men in the pulpit today who never rebuke sin except at a long distance. Modern preachers are holding back profitable words of exhortation for fear that they might not be popular with the members of the congregation. Preachers need to read Galatians 1:8-10 to set some priorities straight. Let us speak the truth in love (Ephesians 4:15) and remember Galatians 4:16 when people frown at us for doing so.

"And taught you publicly and from house to house." Paul's teaching fell into two categories: (1) public proclamation of the truth and (2) evangelism from house to house. Paul pointed out that in the true apostolic

method of evangelizing a community and edifying a congregation, diligent work from house to house was on a par with that in the pulpit. Such is not the case in many of our congregations today. People expect pulpit preaching to produce miracle growth. This is not 20/20 evangelism. Acts 5:42 tells us that first century Christians never ceased to teach and to preach Jesus Christ at the temple AND AT HOME. If we are to succeed at 20/20 evangelism we must work from house to house. If we are going to stress a restoration of New Testament Christianity in the 20th century [and now the 21st century-MRM] then we must restore the spirit of New Testament evangelism. Anything less is hypocritical, imperfect and not 20/20 evangelism. Brothers and sisters, spread the glad news. Don't hold back anything profitable and teach both publicly and privately. Let's practice 20/20 evangelism as Paul prescribes in Acts 20:20!!

As we begin 2020, our theme verse is Acts 20:20. Therein, Paul told the Ephesian elders, “I **kept back nothing** that was **profitable** unto you, but **have shewed you**, and have **taught you publicly**, and **from house to house**.” Our mission at MSOP is to train men to “preach the Word” (2 Tim. 4:2). As noted in the theme verse above, preaching the Word means holding back nothing that is profitable. We train our students to preach the whole counsel of God (Acts 20:26-27).

Preaching the Word also involves showing our hearers the truth of God’s message, both by our lives and by our lips. We do this by taking heed to ourselves first, and also to the doctrine (cf. Acts 20:28; 1 Tim. 4:16).

We also train our students to preach/teach the Word, both publicly, and from house to house. While we esteem the importance and power of pulpit preaching, we do not believe it is the entirety of the preacher’s work. We endeavor also to train our students to be evangelistic, and to develop a desire to conduct Bible studies in their homes, and from house to house!

Gospel preaching, that follows the template of Acts 20:20, is preaching that magnifies Christ. This is the kind of preaching you will hear at our annual lectureship (March 29-April 2, 2020). Our schedule is included within this alumni newsletter for your perusal. We would love to see you there, and we love you for helping us train men how to preach “Acts 20:20 style” in 2020 and beyond!

Mission Reports

Marlin Retana (2017) writes, “Our work in Panama keeps growing. We recently celebrated the first anniversary of our small congregation. We usually have an attendance of 20 or more, including some visitors. We have heard good comments from brethren who visit us from other congregations and the impact of the work we have been doing in our town. Social media has been of good help, including contacts from other parts of the country as well as from other nations who are seeking the Truth. Recordings of our studies and sermons are shared on the Facebook and YouTube pages of the congregation. More details of the congregation can be found at <http://idclasvillas.org/english/>. Since last October, I have been blessed with the opportunity to work on Spanish content for World Video Bible School. We recorded five videos last October and are currently working on three more, all of them with an evangelistic approach. You can visit (and please share with Spanish contacts) at www.buscandolaverdad.org. We are also working to start an Online Spanish Bible School, which will require a lot of our time and efforts. More details will be provided later. Financial support is always needed and appreciated (contact me if you would like to know more about how to help us). Please keep us, our brethren, and the work in Panama, and the entire world, in your prayers. To Him be all glory.”

Ron Gilbert (1973) of International Bible Teaching Ministries writes, “We are still having great results from our Gospel meetings in Africa. We have been sending \$300.00 per Gospel meeting for the preacher schools to take some of the instructors and students and go out for Gospel meetings in their areas. The

funds are used for travel expense, food, and sometimes lodging. We have had over 100 baptisms, 300 restorations, and some new congregations started. We have been waiting until the rains in some areas stop and then we will resume the Gospel meetings. If you or your congregation would like to sponsor a Gospel Meeting in Africa, send the funds to us, and we will wire the funds to the preacher schools in Africa. We are doing Gospel meetings in Zambia, Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Malawi and Ghana. In our last newsletter, we listed our budget for our 2020 August mission trip to Zambia and Malawi. In order to ship the 200,000 Gospel tracts, 5,000 Bibles, 10,000 song books, and 12,000 BCC booklets and books for the schools, we need to raise \$50,000.00. We have raised half of these needed funds. If you have not sent funds to help with our mission trip to Africa this year, please do so now. We need most of these funds before the trip to purchase and ship these items. Please consider helping with this mission effort. Please make checks to Ronald D. Gilbert-Mission Fund, and mail to Rock Valley church of Christ, PO Box 49494, Cookeville, TN. 38506 and mark for “Africa Trip”. We will send a financial report to those churches and individuals who help with this trip.”

I am grateful for all they have done in helping us over many years. The elders for the Alkire Road Church of Christ in Grove City, Ohio have agreed to assume this responsibility. Please make the checks payable to Alkire Rd Church of Christ; earmarked “Denton Landon Mission Fund.” Travel plans for 2020 are: Ukraine in March teaching Isaiah for the second year students; back to Ukraine in June teaching the first two classes for a new group of Masters students; in August to Ghana also for a new group of Masters students; back to Ukraine for Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther on Labor Day weekend; then finishing the year with a November trip to Trinidad for Masters classes. In April, Jo was diagnosed with what was once known as Wegener's Disease, now referred to as Granulomatosis with Polyangiitis, a form of necrotising vasculitis. It is an autoimmune disease effecting the small and medium blood vessels. There is no known cause or cure. There is no way to predict when, why, or how long it will flare up and, as mysteriously, subside, becoming dormant for an unpredictable period of time. Presently Jo wants me to continue traveling for this important work in the kingdom. Please keep her in your prayers both now and in the future as we deal with her health. It is a blessing our daughter Lydia is living with us and a help to her especially while I travel.”

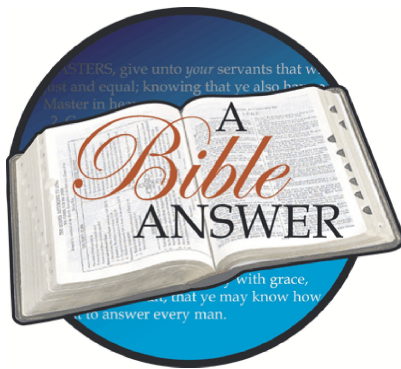

“ONE STEP AT A TIME”

It has been observed that “the journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step.” I thought about those words of wisdom early Monday morning as I began the long drive home from Bristol, Virginia: total distance – 982 miles. I don’t recall having ever driven that distance by myself in a single day. Come to think of it, I can’t recall having driven that far even with someone else in the car. I had intended to break the trip up into two legs, and spend the night somewhere around Brinkley, Arkansas, but once I arrived at Brinkley it was early afternoon and I thought, “I can get further than this.” Sure enough, I could, and the further I drove, the closer home appeared in my mental window. With each mile behind me, there remained less ahead of me and the shortened distance to my destination motivated me to press on. I managed to miss the heavy traffic in Knoxville, Cookeville, and Memphis, but not so with Nashville. If you ever find yourself on a freeway in Tennessee, it might be wise to follow the advice of a native Tennessean in order to calculate the proper speed limit on one of their freeways: “Subtract your age from 100. Double this number if your car has dual exhaust. Conversely, add your age to 100 if you are driving on I-40 or suffering from a midlife crisis.” The same person suggested that when driving through Knoxville, never use your turn signal, unless of course you are on the freeway with no intention of merging. I digress, however, so let me return to the subject at hand.

Abraham is said to have “looked for the city which hath the foundations, whose builder and maker is God” (Heb. 11:10). Like Abraham, those men and women of faith

listed in Hebrews chapter eleven “all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth” (Heb. 11:13). Their faith motivated them to endure great odds in order to reach a destination that cannot be found on a GPS or located in some Rand McNally Road Map. It is, however, as much a journey as was my trip from Bristol, Virginia to Fort Worth, Texas. This journey is not measured in miles, but it does demand maturity on the part of those who would successfully complete the trip. You and I are traveling the same road as our ancient predecessors. Here are some things to keep in mind.

First, don’t get distracted. It is unfortunate that the devil has successfully “blinded the eyes of the unbelieving” (2 Cor. 4:4), so much so that the masses are not even aware of the existence of the inevitable destination to which they are traveling. My journey from Virginia took me past the exit for highway 66 that would take the traveler to Pigeon Forge, Gatlinburg, and the Smokey mountains. I could have visited Rock City, Lookout Mountain, or Ruby Falls, but those side trips, and hundreds and thousands like them, would have hindered me on my journey, perhaps even keeping me from my destination. I sometimes wonder how many precious souls are kept from reaching their spiritual destination for no other reason than the fact that they took a “side road” to enjoy some pleasure for the moment, allowing the devil to deter them from the truly important. The “lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the vainglory of life” (1 John 2:16) distracted

them along the way, and they ended up pursuing things temporal rather than things eternal.

Second, don't get discouraged. The sheer distance, when carefully calculated and considered, would discourage any sane person from attempting to complete the journey in one day. Then there were the inevitable obstacles along the way: road construction, heavy traffic, potholes, work zones with their "fees doubled when workers present." This does not even take into account those rude and obnoxious drivers that one might encounter along the way. Quite often when I begin a journey someone says, "Drive carefully!" I appreciate that thoughtfulness, but is there some reason that I would not drive carefully? So, I often respond, "I will; but so must everyone else with whom I come in close proximity along the way." There are also obstacles along the road to our heavenly home that, if permitted, could discourage us in the journey. There are unforeseen circumstances that come along that would defeat us. We have to struggle with ourselves; that may very well be the greatest obstacle we encounter along the way. Then, there are people who discourage us. I'm not suggesting they do it intentionally. An unkind word, a failure to uphold our hands in the work we are doing; these are things that often discourage us. When we do not see the fruits of our labors immediately, we tend to get discouraged in the work, often giving up in despair. If you find yourself discouraged along the journey, take your Bible and read again those words from the Holy Spirit penned by the hand of Paul: "Wherefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord" (1 Cor. 15:58). "And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we

faint not" (Gal. 6:9).

Third, let us be determined. Thomas Jefferson is credited with having said, "When we see ourselves in a situation which must be endured and gone through, it is best to make up our minds to it, meet it with firmness and accommodate everything to it in the best way practicable. This lessens the evil, while fretting and fuming only serves to increase your own torments." Some years ago, I came across this interesting true-life example of determination:

The year was 1983. In Australia, the long-distance foot race from Sydney to Melbourne was about to begin, covering 875 kilometers - more than 500 miles! About 150 world-class athletes had entered, for what was planned as a six-day event. So, race officials were startled when a 61-year-old man approached and handed them his entry form. His name was Cliff Young, and his "racing attire" included overalls and galoshes over his work boots. At first, they refused to let him enter. So, he explained that he'd grown up on a 2,000-acre farm, with thousands of sheep. His family could afford neither horses nor tractors so, when the storms came, his job was to round up the sheep. Sometimes, he said, it would take two or three days of running. Finally, they let Cliff enter, and the race began. The others quickly left him way behind, shuffling along in his galoshes. But he didn't know the plan included stopping each night to rest, so he kept going. By the fifth day, he had caught them all, won the race, and became a national hero. He continued to compete in long-distance races until well up in his seventies. He was an inspiration to millions and a great encourager of younger runners. In his honor and memory, in 2004, the year after his death at age 81, the organizers of the race where he first gained fame permanently changed its name to the


Cliff Young Australian Six Day Race. What was the key to Cliff Young's success? It goes by various names: determination, perseverance, persistence, tenacity. It means keeping one's eye fixed steadfastly on a goal, and not stopping, no matter the difficulties or the obstacles, until that goal is achieved.

Here, then, are three important keys to beginning, enduring, and completing our journey to heaven: Don't get discouraged, don't be distracted, and be determined. Take the journey one step at a time, and never lose your love for heaven. The history of mankind is marked by a long list of nameless men and

women who began the journey, who faced calamity and hardship, only to give up. In the words of the Psalmist, "They turned back" (Ps. 78:9). Let me remind you that the benefits of determination and the reward for successfully completing the journey far outweigh the alternative. Like I said when I began this article, and with but slight alternation in the words, let me remind all of us: "With each passing day behind me there remains one less day ahead of me, and the shortened distance to my destination motivates me to press on."

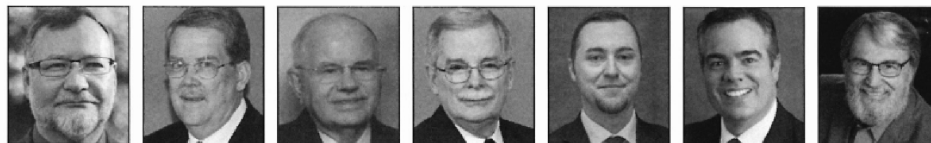
