Africa Mission Report

Ron Gilbert (1973) of International Bible Teaching Ministries writes in his recent newsletter, "Several of our preacher school graduates in Africa have sent their reports concerning their work for the Lord during 2020. The revised numbers for 2020 are as follows: baptisms- 6,749, restorations- 5,877, new congregations established- 184 and 75 preachers graduated from preacher schools. We rejoice at these reports from our preaching brethren. Over 500 men have graduated from these schools since September 2007 when IBTM started. We are getting closer to sending the 2 containers to Africa. We believe we now have all the government paper work done in Africa by these 2 schools that will receive the containers. One of these schools was registered with their government but had to be re-registered in order to receive a container of humanitarian aid. Hopefully, we can ship both containers soon. We have started making our plans to go to Africa in August. We are praying that things will be open, and we will be allowed to go.... There have been 3 more Gospel meetings in Africa during the past few weeks. During one of these meetings in Western Kenya, a lady that was 115 years old was baptized into Christ!"

Africa Mission Report

Howell Ferguson (1984) writes in his recent newsletter concerning the work at Chimala, "The gospel is still being

preached locally and in the week-end evangelism efforts of the CSOP. Having Nathan (Howell's son) now living at the mission is also a huge benefit to helping address areas that confront us. He will be able to give fresh insights into some of the challenges that have tested the farm programs as well as provide a second set of eyes over the financial operations of the various departments. There are many projects waiting to begin, but the local management has to demonstrate leadership, accountability, and the ability to make difficult decisions before we begin. This is not a popular concept, but we believe it is vital to future growth and development of the church in general and the Chimala Mission in particular. Much of my time spent on this trip was to help the departments see where they are falling behind and assist them in finding solutions to overcome any shortcomings. We have been emphasizing the importance of "owning" this work; as it will never succeed without this vital attitude engraved in the Tanzanians' hearts. We do not know when, but the day will ultimately come when the Chimala Mission will be placed solely into the hands of the Tanzanians. This is the direction that past overseeing churches have been moving towards for decades. However, until that day comes, we will continue to need help from American churches and missionaries. With Nathan, Kristi, Eden, and Emmy now established in their new Chimala Mission home, we are hopeful it will motivate other American families to also take the brave step to join them. Currently, there are three large and two medium missionary

houses that are sitting empty waiting for missionaries to inhabit, bringing their talents to Chimala. Nearly every kind of talent is needed; but if you have medical, administrative, or financial experience, that would be a huge plus. Also, any retired farming couple would be very welcomed."

Singapore Mission Report

Jamie Long (1997) writes, "We are excited to tell you that Jessica and I have moved to Singapore this month. We are living in a temporary housing for three months, as required by the Singapore government. After this, we will move into an apartment that will be our permanent residence for the rest of our Singapore stay. I have committed to working full-time with the Four Seas College of Bible and Missions beginning April 26, 2021. I have been teaching online since October 2018 until April 16, 2021. Other than being an Instructor, I am also serving as Dean of Admissions. We count this as a great opportunity and believe that the Lord has opened "a great door and effectual" (1 Cor. 16:9). The college was founded by the late brother Ira Rice and is now under the leadership of brother Peter Chin (President), who is also a graduate of the Memphis School of Preaching. This work is being overseen by the elders of the Jurong Church of Christ in Singapore. Our over 200 graduates serve and have served in countries across Asia including Malaysia, Singapore, Indonesia, Philippines, Cambodia, Vietnam, Laos, Thailand, Philippines, China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Nepal, India, and Sri Lanka. OUR TIME OF DEATH

When someone dies, the County Coroner will list the cause and time of death on the death certificate. None of us know beforehand when that time will be.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-2 states, "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: A time to be born, and a time to die." The Bible teaches that God knows when we shall die. No person knows the specific hour or minute of his death. Only the all-knowing God knows. The fact that God foreknows it in no way implies that at our birth He set the time and fixed it so that there is nothing we can do to lengthen or shorten our lives. Neither does it mean that God has arbitrarily set the time of our death. I know there are those who say that everyone has a "time to die" and that if it is not your time, you will not die, or if it is your time, you cannot keep from it. The Bible does not teach this.

Jesus made it clear that one can die at any moment. In John 7:6-8, "Then Jesus said unto them, *My time is not yet come: but your time is alway ready.* The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth, because I testify of it, that the works thereof are evil. Go ye up unto this feast: I go not up yet unto this feast: for my time is not yet full come." On that occasion, Jesus could not go up to the feast with His disciples because His appointed time to die had not come. His death was to be at one appointed time. However, it did not matter when the disciples went. He said, "My time is not yet come: but your time is alway ready." Here is clear evidence that individuals do not have a pre-determined time for their death as Jesus did.

The Bible clearly teaches that we can shorten or lengthen our life-span by the way

that we live. Proverbs 10:27 says, "The fear of the Lord prolongeth days: but the years of the wicked shall be shortened." A person can hasten the time of his death. This is done daily by thousands who conduct themselves foolishly while driving a vehicle, participating in some violent sports, or by destroying their bodies by drugs and alcohol. A person may hasten his death by taking his own life such as King Saul and Judas did. A person may hasten his death by committing crimes punishable by the death penalty. Men have the power to bring about their own death.

A person may also prolong his life. Psalm 90:10 states, "The days of our years are threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength they be fourscore years...." King Hezekiah is a Biblical example of a man given extended years. In answer to his prayer, God added fifteen years to his life (Isa. 38:1-5). Paul points out also, that God may extend mercy in time of sickness (Phil. 2:27). He also reminded the Ephesians, "Honour thy father and mother; which is the first commandment with promise; That it may be well with thee, and thou mayest live long on the earth" (Eph. 6:2).

Since we do not know when we shall die, we must be prepared at all times. If we knew when we were going to die, we might wait until the time was almost on us before obeying the gospel. Instead, we should say as did Isaac, "I know not the day of my death" (Gen. 27:2). Satan desires for us to wait, but as Paul says, "... behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2).

Brethren, let us be among the blessed dead who die in the Lord (Rev. 14:13).
