MSOP receives no federal or state grants, or other governmental support, and charges no tuition or fees of its students. The many hundreds of graduates preaching throughout the world tell us their training at MSOP was the hardest work they ever did—and loved! # A TIMELESS WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT FROM THE LATE CURTIS A. CATES, PAST MSOP DIRECTOR Bobby Liddell

While I served as Director, I asked brother Curtis A. Cates (1941-2013), who served as MSOP Director from 1983-2007, to write a word about why MSOP was worthy of support. In his usual excellent way, he wrote an article (printed in the Yokefellow, 34:7, Nov-Dec, 2007) whose words still live on. I have edited the article to bring some statements and numbers up to date. I know you will benefit from a careful reading of what our dear, lamented brother penned sixteen years ago. My editorial comments will be in italics, in parentheses, and noted with BL.

#### APPRECIATION, CONFIDENCE, AND A PRAYER

Dear fellow Christians, a tremendous work of the Lord dear to my heart is the Memphis School of Preaching. I will address this work in three areas: appreciation, confidence, and a prayer.

In the first place, I wish to express my deepest appreciation to you and to the other faithful brethren who for more than four decades (57 years now, BL) have supported the School in its invaluable work of educating capable, dedicated "men of the Book." The approximately twelve hundred men (as of 2007, BL), with their dedicated families, have preached the gospel in countless foreign countries and throughout the United States. In addition, graduates are also involved in teaching, writing, directing, and/or otherwise working and serving in numerous schools, major periodicals, radio-television media, and lectureship series in the U. S. and abroad. Our Savior Himself stated, "Therefore by their fruits ye shall know them" (Mat. 7:21). I believe the Memphis School of Preaching, under the capable oversight of the faithful Forest Hill eldership, has brought forth good fruit and that the church universally has benefitted.

In the second place, I wish to express my deepest confidence in the School's unswerving, determined dedication to the old primitive gospel. Absolute loyalty to the pristine, pure Word has been its "polar star," under the directorship of Roy J. Hearn and Curtis A. Cates, and now under the capable directorship of Bobby Liddell (*I was Director when this article was written, B. J. Clarke is now serving, in a great way, as Director, BL*). Her graduates have always known "the Book," and that powerful purpose and result continues— and shall continue! Thus, I feel very privileged and excited to continue with the MSOP and have every confidence in the elders, the director, and the faculty.

Consequently, in the third place, I wish to express my deep prayer. God is good. His Word teaches us that He hears fervent prayers of His precious children when those prayers are to His glory. Brethren, the Lord has blessed the School with a beautiful campus and great facilities, including the stately N. B. Hardeman Library. Now, through His marvelous grace and the vision and faith of so many, thirty-two wonderful three-bedroom apartments have been erected on campus, which are now housing over forty splendid future preachers [students] and their wives and children. How delightful to see them walk hand-in-hand to the church services, or to the Hardeman Library to do research, or to classes in the School! How delightful to see the closeness the students are building with one another, to see their children playing together! I wish you folks could be here to witness these tremendous blessings.

What is my prayer? (Brother Cates made an earnest appeal for funds to pay off the School's indebtedness for student housing—and, with God's help, the indebtedness of \$3,500,000 was paid off soon thereafter, BL). Brethren, I thank you for all you have done and continue to do.You can have every confidence in our continuing, unswerving loyalty to truth. Please allow me, then, to ask you. Will you join me in my prayer for this special need? (He continued by asking for brethren to include the School in their budgets, and many did, BL.) What a tremendous help to the cause of Christ...as we educate these students to preach thirty, forty, fifty, or more years! What a boost it would be to sending faithful laborers into the ripe harvest! (And, it has been, BL.) I pray that you can help. God bless you all. ~

As brother Cates appealed for help then, so do we now. The Forest Hill congregation leads the way in supporting the efforts of training preachers at MSOP, contributing hundreds of thousands of dollars to provide a place for instruction, a qualified faculty and staff, and all the many material things needed for quality instruction. #### ENCOURAGE MEN TO PREACH Bobby Liddell

Many hundreds of faithful men have graduated from MSOP, and each one of them needed the encouragement of those whom they loved and trusted. We need to begin early to train boys, as did Lois and Eunice (2 Tim. 3:15), impress upon them positive aspects of serving the Lord by preaching the Gospel, and assure them we will be very pleased if they dedicate their lives to being God's heralds. Let us praise their initial, perhaps feeble, efforts when they stand at those make-believe pulpits, and deliver their first "sermons." Our commendation, and smile of approval, along with a hug of tender love may be just what these young men need in order to chart their courses for life. Never discourage a good man from preaching (2 Tim. 2:2).

#### Send Men To MSOP

There are many good, faithful, dedicated brothers who are looking for the way to prepare themselves to preach, or who are wondering if they have what it takes to preach. Point them in our direction. Give them information about the School. Inform us of their contact information, and we will be glad to get in touch with them. Encourage them to visit MSOP. We will meet with them, show them around the campus, and allow them to sit in on classes. Your recommendation may be just what they need to get them on the road to a lifetime of preaching the soul-saving Gospel of Christ. Instead of lamenting sin in the world, and the shortage of preachers, send men to MSOP.

Men who leave homes, families, and jobs—because they have committed themselves to two years of intensive, college level instruction in the Word of God, and in how to preach it with effectiveness—deserve your support (1 Tim. 5:18).
