WE THAT ARE STRONG

of the weak, and not to please ourselves" (Romans 15:1).

Paul had just discussed matters of the conscience, activities that were not inherently wrong, but in which some could not engage with a clean conscience (Romans 14:14). The "weak" described brethren whose consciences were more restrictive (Romans 14:1-2). It was not that these brethren were weak nor that their faith was weak: they simply had weak consciences (see 1 Corinthians 8:7, 12). Paul counselled those with a "weak" conscience to "have it to thyself before God" (Romans 14:22). They were not to condemn others by imposing their personal convictions on others (Romans 14:22; see also 14:3-4), nor were they to condemn themselves by violating their consciences (Romans 14:22-23; see also 14:14, 20-21).

To those who were not "weak," whose consciences were not as prone toward guilt in matters of personal judgment, Paul counseled them not to devalue their brethren (Romans 14:3), destroy their brethren (Romans 14:15), nor to defile their brethren over their convictions (Romans 14:21). Instead, "We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves" (Romans 15:1).

How many saints read the words, "We then that are strong," and think to themselves, "Nope, that's not me: I'm one of the weak ones"? Let us face it: few. Instead, most Christians like to think of themselves as strong.

Yes, chances are, that includes you, too.

So, since so many Christians tend to view themselves as strong, then we "that are strong" need to take Paul's words to heart and consider the way strong saints treat their fellow Christians.

If We Are So Strong,

Let Us Be Pleasing to God's Children (Rom. 15:1-3).

Let us be strong enough to be selfless in our decisions, putting our preferences and pleasures to the side for the sake of our brethren's wellbeing. Let us be strong enough to use discretion in our discussions, choosing our words and subject matter carefully. Let us be strong enough to be considerate in our clothing, avoiding the extremes of ostentation and laxity, being mindful to find the balance that exhibits modesty, decency, and reverence without turning ourselves into a fashion show.

Are we willing to bear with our brethren (Romans 15:1)? Are we willing to build up our brethren (Romans

If We Are So Strong,

Let Us Be Patient with God's Children (Rom. 15:4-5).

Patience is imperative. It takes an enduring patience to dig into a steadfast study of the scriptures and comprehend the comfort that God provides (Romans 15:4). God is the God of patience and comfort

"We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities (consolation - Romans 15:5), and when we learn patience and comfort from Him, we will practice patience and comfort with our brethren. We will be patient enough to be likeminded toward one another, remembering that God has been patient with us.

Christians "that are strong" have patience, therefore they do not dismiss their brethren as worthless over petty disagreements. The "strong" understand that new children of God will not have instant maturity of faith, and so they give them time to learn and to grow in the wisdom and knowledge of God. The "strong" realize that their brethren may have sincere questions that need answered, and they will readily and happily help them to find the book-chapter-verse answers to their important questions.

If We Are So Strong,

Let Us Have Peace with God's Children (Rom. 15:6-7).

Christians "that are strong" will reject the modern mantra of "You are defined by your past." Contrary to what the world tells us, we can "be likeminded one toward another" (Romans 15:5). We can "with one mind and one mouth glorify God" (Romans 15:6). Saints can be likeminded despite different ethnic backgrounds, educational backgrounds, or economic backgrounds, because they share the common ground of Christ.

None are stronger than Jesus, and if the sinless Christ was willing to receive each of us despite our sinful pasts, we each can receive each other (Romans 15:7). Christians "that are strong" will overcome any gap, whether black or white, American or Russian, rich or poor, young or old, Ford or Chevy, Coke or Pepsi, or any other combination of distinguishing traits, in order to stand on common ground, seeing eye to eye, and being likeminded in

No, peace may not always be possible (Romans 12:18). No, the "strong" cannot be likeminded with those who cause divisions and offenses contrary to the very doctrine of Christ (Romans 16:17). Nevertheless, with the exception of doctrinal error or contentious characters, being likeminded is not only possible: it is vital.

Do "the weak" have any responsibility to be pleasing to God's children, patient with God's children, and having peace with God's children? Absolutely: in fact, while Romans 15 begins with Paul specifically addressing the "strong," his focus next shifted to both the strong and the weak when he said, "Let every one of us please his neighbor for his good to edification" (Romans 15:2).

These exhortations are for all saints, whether they see themselves as strong or not. However, since being "strong" connects to the idea of having ability, let us "that are strong" remember that we have the ability to strengthen the church by having the strength to put others before ourselves.
